
Serving Asteroids



Objective: This drill is excellent practice serving to the target and is a fun way for younger athletes to interact.

Directions:

- 1. The players are divided into two even groups of six or more and each group goes to its own side of the court.
- 2. One group is chosen to serve first and the other will be the "asteroids."
- 3. The asteroids group lines up along its baseline with their backs toward the servers on the other side of the court.
- 4. The asteroids interlock arms and then shuffle step sideways in a straight line from one sideline to the other.
- 5. When the asteroid group reaches the other sideline, the entire group takes one big step backwards and toward the net.
- 6. Then the asteroids shuffle to the other sideline and take another big step backward toward the net.
- 7. This process keeps going until the asteroid group actually touches the net.
- 8. Simutaneously, the serving group tries to hit the asteroids by serving volleyballs.
- 9. When an asteroid is hit, her or she has to leave the group and the rest of the asteroids interlock arms once again and keep going.
- 10. Once the asteroids get to the net or they are all hit, the two groups switch.
- 11. Whichever group has the most remaining asteroids when they reach the net wins the game.
